INTENT

Rationale:

At Buglawton Primary School, our Art curriculum is designed to be accessible to all so that every child knows more, remembers more and understands more. At Buglawton, we believe that all pupils can achieve in Art. We do not put ceilings on what pupils can achieve and we do not hold pre-conceptions about any pupils' ability to make progress. - A scheme of work that focuses on progressive skills and knowledge in creating, understanding and appreciating art
- Planned opportunities to learn art within a wider context alongside other curriculum subjects
- Opportunities for pupils' participation in local art competitions and exhibitions o Extra-curricular opportunities to participate in art
- A scheme of work that teaches children how to draw, print, sculpt, sew, print and collage in a progressive way, year on year.
- Opportunities for whole school and class enrichment.
- A scheme of work that focuses on specific and relevant vocabulary
- A subject leader who monitors teaching and learning to improve standards and outcomes • A link governor who liaises with the subject leader in order to monitor and improve standards
