What should I already know?	What should I be able to do by the end of the unit?
 Understand how simple 3-D textile products are made, using a template to create two identical shapes. Understand how to join fabrics using different techniques e.g. running stitch, glue, over stitch, stapling. Explore different finishing techniques. Know and use technical vocabulary relevant to the project. 	 Identify a purpose for what they intend to design and make. Develop their ideas through talk and drawings and label parts. Begin to select tools and materials; use correct vocabulary to name and describe them. Explore how products can be made stronger, stiffer and more stable. With help, measure, cut and score with some accuracy. Demonstrate how to cut, shape and join fabric to make a simple product. Use basic sewing techniques. Look at a range of existing products explain what they like and dislike about products and why. Start to evaluate their products as they are developed, identifying strengths and possible changes they might make.
