To achieve our goals, we have established:

- Whole-school and class-based enrichment opportunities.
- A scheme of work emphasizing relevant and precise vocabulary.
- Professional development for staff to ensure effective curriculum delivery.
- Home learning tasks to reinforce and expand students' understanding.
- A subject leader to oversee and enhance teaching standards and outcomes.
- A link governor who collaborates with the subject leader to maintain and improve standards.
- A curriculum tailored to the needs of all pupils, including those with SEND and PPG.
- A clear, progressive study program in line with the Cheshire East Agreed Syllabus.
- An enquiry-based learning approach, using key concepts and guiding questions.
- Planned opportunities to develop skills like Investigating, Reflecting, Expressing, and Empathising, often integrated with other subjects.
- Activities that promote curiosity, open-mindedness, respect, and critical thinking through assemblies, community events, and workshops led by religious leaders.
- Access to artefacts and resources for hands-on exploration and investigation.

IMPACT

As a result of our comprehensive approach:

- Students will effectively use RE-specific vocabulary.
- Students will meet age-related expectations.
- Students will build upon and retain their RE knowledge.
- Students will display positive attitudes towards people of all religions and understand cultural beliefs different from their own.
